7.1 ESTABLISH LEVEL I SCHOOL MITIGATION FEES

•The District is proposing to impose Level I school mitigation fees of \$2.24 per square foot for residential development, and \$.36 per square foot for commercial development. This proposal was publicly noticed in the Lincoln News-Messenger. This hearing provides opportunity for interested members of the public to comment on the proposal. The fees are effective sixty days after adoption.

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- 8.1 (D/A) RATIFY THE TENETAIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE WESTERN PLACER UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE WESTERN PLACER CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES' ASSOCIATION TO AMEND ARTICLE VI, PARAGRAPH D OF THE CONTRACT – Stewart (03-04 G & O Component IV-V)**
- Historically bus driver's pay period runs from 16th to the 15th of each month. This pay structure necessitated that the drivers be paid on the first day of each month, instead of the last workday of each month like other regular employee in the district. In an effort to standardize their payrolls for all of the school districts in Placer County, we were asked to adjust our bus driver payroll process. This action will put the bus drivers on the same payroll cycle as everyone else.
- 8.2 (D/A) APPROVE THE CONFIDENTIAL EMPLOYEE RECLASSIFICATION STUDY EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2004 - Stewart (03-04 G & O Component IV-V)**
- The second year of the two-year salary and benefit agreement with the confidential employees stipulated that a reclassification study would be performed and then implemented as of July 01, 2004. Those positions that were not reclassified would instead receive a 1.50% salary increase. The total cost for the confidential employees' salary improvement is \$24,036. This increase was already reflected in the District's multi-year projections.
- 8.3 (D/A) APPROVE THE CERTIFICATED MANAGEMENT EMPLOYEE SALARY IMPROVEMENT EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2004 – Stewart (03-04 G & O Component IV-V)**
- The second year of the two-year salary and benefit agreement with the certificated management employees stipulated that a salary comparison would be performed with neighboring school districts and implemented as of July 1, 2004. Those positions that were found to be in line with the comparison school district would instead receive a 1.50% salary increase. The remainder of the certificated management positions will receive a 1.50% salary increase. This increase was already reflected in the District's multi-year projections.
- 8.4 (D/A) ADOPT DECLARATION OF NEED FOR FULLY QUALIFIED EDUCATORS – Noyes (04 G & O Component IV)**
- Each year the District must declare that there is an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the district's employment criteria for the positions listed on the attached form. The declaration shall remain in force until June 30, 2005.

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- 8.5 (D/A) APPROVE RESOLUTION 03/04.41 TO ESTABLISH SCHOOL FEES – Stewart (03-04 G & O Component IV)**
•The attached resolution authorizes the District to impose level I school mitigation fees of \$2.24 per square foot for residential development, and \$.36 per square foot for commercial development. The fees are effective sixty days after the adoption of the resolution. The District is currently performing a Level II study, which may allow the school district to charge a higher fee.
