7. PUBLIC HEARING

The District does not have adequate non-severe special education grants to fully fund the special education expansion project at Foskett Ranch. The State Allocation Board allows districts to utilize eligible grants at different grade levels as long as they show they can adequately house the students whose eligibility will be utilized. The attached Housing Plan and Resolution will enable the District to access otherwise eligible grants to fund the project. Staff is asking for up to 22 grants as we are currently discussing with OPSC our eligibility for both our non-severe and severe special education population.

The District's special education eligibility will be increasing in the coming years due to our taking back programs from the county. The use of Grants will have a negligible effect on the District's overall eligibility.

- Each year the District has one day to provide inservice to all 600+ employees. All groups are represented at the inservice day, and workshop topics are designed to be relevant and informative to each employee's job description. The focus for our 2009 – 2010 District Inservice Day on August 17 was "Using Differentiation and Professional Learning Communities to Ensure Academic Success". Topics ranged from CALPADS implementation and the importance of accurate data entry, to the use of technology to monitor student achievement (OARS – Online Assessment Reporting Systems and AERIES Gradebook), to instructional techniques to enhance reading comprehension (GLAD Chants and SIPPS – Systematic Instruction in Phonics, Phonemic Awareness and Sight Words), to Differentiating Lessons for All Learners (use of GATE strategies and icons for intervention and enrichment), to Special Education Review, Business, Maintenance and Transportation inservices and information.

8.6 (I/D) PRELIMINARY LOOK AT STAR TEST SCORES 2009 – Boyle (08-09 G & O Component I, IV)

- STAR Test score results from April 2009 testing have been received from the California Department of Education (CDE). Individual student results have been mailed home and school and grade-level/course results have been distributed to school sites. CDE has not yet released the Academic Performance Index (API) or the Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) results for schools or for school districts – those results should be released in early September.

8.7 (D/A) APPROVAL OF A GUARANTEED MAXIMUM PRICE FOR THE LINCOLN HIGH SCHOOL RELOCATABLES & CAMPUS MODERNIZATION PROJECT, INCREMENT #2 OF 2 BETWEEN SEWARD L. SCHREDER CONSTRUCTION, INC. & THE WESTERN PLACER UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT – Allen (08-09 G & O Component IV, V)

- The District advertised for a Lease Lease-Back Developer for the construction plans at Lincoln High School. Staff has chosen the firm of Seward L. Schreder Construction, Inc. A Facilities Lease, Site Lease and General Conditions, including a Construction Contract Agreement has been prepared. Both parties legal counsel have approved the documents. Before the Board tonight is the approval for Increment #2 of the LHS project Guaranteed Maximum Price. The GMP includes a contingency and several allowances for portions of the project that have yet to be clearly identified or defined. These allowances are based on what is currently in the approved plans and specifications and may be reduced due to value engineering during the project. All remaining contingency funds and allowances will be returned to the district.

•The Board of Trustees will take action to approve the FY 2009-10 special tax levy for developed parcels within the Western Placer Unified School District's Community Facilities District No. 1. There are 2,719 parcels for a total levy of \$1,887,483.00. This is a 2 percent increase from the previous fiscal year and \$6,000 less than budgeted.

•The Board of Trustees will take action to approve the FY 2009-10 special tax levy for developed parcels within the Western Placer Unified School District's Community Facilities District No. 2. There are 4,265 parcels for a total levy of \$3,248,516.28. This is a 1 percent decrease from the previous fiscal year and \$17,000 more than budgeted.

•On January 1, 2010, the District's Series 2006B Certificates of Participation (COPs) are set to convert from a fixed to a variable interest rate. As part of the District's debt management and restructuring plan, the District scheduled to evaluate whether to restructure one or both of the outstanding Series 2006 COPs.

District staff is working with Cathy Dominico of Capitol Public Financing Group on exploring financial solutions for maximizing the District's resources and minimizing the impact of existing debt repayment on the General Fund.

8.13 (I) LETTER FROM PERRY-SMITH REGARDING WESTERN PLACER UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT'S ANNUAL INDEPENDENT AUDIT – Ryland (08-09 G & O Component V)

•The District's auditors, Perry-Smith LLP, have begun working on the independent audit of the District for the year ended June 30, 2009. As part of their professional obligation to the District, Perry-Smith LLC has provided the Governing Board with information regarding the conduct of the annual audit and has requested that the attached letter be shared with the Governing Board.

- 8.14 (D/A) CLASSIFIED MANAGEMENT SALARY SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT – Leaman (08-09 G & O Component IV, V)**
- Represented employees received salary and health and welfare benefit increases in June effective July 1, 2009. Analysis and comparison of the classified management salary schedule was completed during the summer. No salary adjustment is being recommended for the 2008-09 school year. Retroactive to July 1, 2009, salary adjustments from 3% to 8% are being recommended to place the attached group at or near the median (middle) of comparison districts, based on past discussion with the Board. A 6% increase in the benefit cap is also being recommended.
- 8.15 (D/A) CLASSIFIED CONFIDENTIAL SALARY SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT – Leaman (08-09 G & O Component IV, V)**
- Represented employees received salary and health and welfare benefit increases in June effective July 1, 2009. Analysis and comparison of the classified confidential salary schedule was completed during the summer. No salary adjustment is being recommended for the 2008-09 school year. Retroactive to July 1, 2009, a salary adjustment of 3% is being recommended to keep the attached group at or near the median (middle) of comparison districts, based on past discussion with the Board. A 6% increase in the benefit cap is also being recommended. Additional professional growth opportunities based on the classified contract are also being forwarded for approval.
- 8.16 (D/A) CERTIFICATED MANAGEMENT SALARY SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT – Leaman (08-09 G & O Component IV, V)**
- Represented employees received salary and health and welfare benefit increases in June effective July 1, 2009. Analysis and comparison of the certificated management salary schedule was completed during the summer. No salary adjustment is being recommended for the 2008-09 school year. Retroactive to July 1, 2009, a salary adjustment of 3% to 8% is being recommended to keep the attached group at or near the median (middle) of comparison districts, based on past discussion with the Board. A 6% increase in the benefit cap is also being recommended. A minor reduction of two duty days is included for the high school principal position.
- 8.17 (D/A) ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT SALARY SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT – Leaman (08-09 G & O Component IV, V)**
- Represented employees received salary and health and welfare benefit increases in June effective July 1, 2009. Analysis and comparison of the assistant superintendent salary schedule was completed during the summer. No salary adjustment is being recommended for the 2008-09 school year. Retroactive to July 1, 2009, a salary adjustment 3% is being recommended to keep the attached group at or near the median (middle) of comparison districts, based on past discussion with the Board. A 6% increase in the benefit cap is also being recommended. An increase of fifty dollars per month in car allowance is also being forwarded for approval. Based on successful performance, a one-year extension on each contract is recommended for approval.
- 8.18 (D/A) SUPERINTENDENT’S SALARY SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT – Leaman (08-09 G & O Component IV, V)**
- Represented employees received salary and health and welfare benefit increases in June effective July 1, 2009. Analysis and comparison of the superintendent salary schedule was completed during the summer. No salary adjustment is being recommended for the 2008-09 school year. Salary adjustments for 2009-10 ranged from 3% to 8% based on the goal of placing each group at the median of the district comparison group. Retroactive to July 1, 2009, a salary adjustment of 6.5% is being recommended. A one-year extension on the superintendent’s contract is also recommended for approval.
