8. REPORTS & COMMUNICATION

- 8.1 Lincoln High School, Student Advisory – Jerusha Loya –
 - Friday was the Academic Rally, spirit t-shirts were given out, Teacher skits were done during the Rally.
 - Planning a Minute to win it

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- Next Monday is Academic day
 - Tuesday STAR testing starts
 - AP Testing will start this month
 - Offering zebra bucks for next year.
- 8.2 **Western Placer Teacher's Association** – Mike Agrippino referred to the budget presentation. He thanked Scott and District staff for engaging in group discussions, the job was more difficult with having funds, he expressed we're better off than other districts. Shared that all groups know that we intend to honor the sacrifices, with supporting class size increases if necessary, some teachers may be reassigned, and other groups will also make similar sacrifices. We will discuss budget decisions being made, and hope other groups are doing the same, students are not responsible for the budget crises and we will continue to give our students top quality of education.
- 8.3 **Western Placer Classified Employee Association** – Mike Kimbrough shared CSEA agrees totally with WPTA, and is also looking at items, such as eliminating two busses, also eliminating contracted landscaping, and trying to preserve the integrity of the schools. He shared going out to the school farm, and what a wonderful job the teachers have done with the farm program. Mike shared before looking at cutting he feels it is important for everyone to see the program that is being offered at the farm.
- 8.4 **Superintendent** – Scott Leaman reported on the following:
- Working on HIS, looking at how resources were being offered outside the area, will continue resources through the end of the year, HIS will bring waiver before the board on May 4th meeting, as well as a public hearing, and hoping all will be resolved.
 - Extreme Drinking presentation will be held at LHS on Wednesday, the 21st in the theater.
 - Will be sending out a survey within the next two week for facilities budget, results will come back in the near future.
 - Foskett Ranch is being awarding a distinguished School Award in June. It was the consensus of the board to send school staff.
 - April 28th will be the "State of the District" for the Chamber breakfast; also Budget Presentation is scheduled for April 28th at the LHS Performing Arts Theater.

9. ♦ACTION ♦DISCUSSION ♦INFORMATION

9.1 Discussion **ACTIVITY SUPERVISOR CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE** –
Noyes (09-10 G & O Component IV)

- AB 1025, Conway. Schools: employees and volunteers: Activity Supervisor Clearance Certificate. Existing law permits qualified credential holders to coach in a competitive sport upon authorization by action of the local governing board, as specified. This bill would require

a non-certificated candidate, commencing on July 1, 2010, prior to assuming a paid or volunteer position to supervise, direct, or coach a pupil activity program sponsored by, or affiliated with, a school district, to obtain from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing an Activity Supervisor Clearance Certificate issued by the commission upon verification of the candidate's personal identification and verification that he or she meets specified requirements. The bill would require that each certificate be issued initially for a period of 5 years and provide that it may be renewed.

The bill would require the commission to submit specified information relating to applicants to the Department of Justice to obtain state and federal criminal history information prior to the issuance of a certificate, as specified, and require the commission to make that information available to the Department of Justice or the Federal Bureau of Investigation, upon request. The bill would also authorize the commission to establish a fee for the certificate.

Mr. Noyes reported on a new bill that is about to take place throughout the State regarding coaches. This bill indicates that there are many volunteers, "Supervisor Certificate" this bill AB1025 will take effect starting July 1, 2010. Current changes are TB-25.00, CIF Certificate-52.00, First Aide-25.00, renewal First Aide 10.00, Fingerprints-75.00, Clearance Certificate-50.00, if your not certificated it would cost 230.00 to certify coaches. If there already certificated their okay.

**9.2 Information/
Discussion**

INTERDISTRICT AGREEMENT/RESIDENCY BASED ON EMPLOYMENT – Leaman (09-10 G & O Component I, II, IV)

- The board will discuss implementation of interdistrict agreements.

Mr. Leaman reported on the four appeals that went before the county, were all approved. He shared the amount of time in processing interdistricts. He shared some ideas due to the most current appeals that were approved, consider possibly contacting the county board members, maybe have some board members attend the meeting appeals, or maybe sending all applications to the county board. We currently have 85% employment and daycare, with 300 various applications that come in for other reasons, if after 30 days the superintendent does not take action, the interdistrict then goes to PCOE. The county superintendent will discuss this issue with the county board. The consensus of the board was to see if the county changes their process. Scott will report back next month.

**9.3 Information/
Discussion**

2009 – 10 AND FUTURE BUDGET REDUCTIONS - Lopes (09-10 G & O Component I, II, IV)

- As discussed in previous Board meetings, in light of the Governor's proposed budget, the Budget Committee began the process of gathering and analyzing budget cut options on January 20, 2010. The Committee

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continued to analyze suggestions through March 25, 2010, and voted on non-negotiable suggestions that had quantifiable dollar amounts attached to their implementation. The total possible votes were 11 and each vote indicated that implementing the suggestion was favorable.

Management, site Principals, WPTA and CSEA have reviewed the suggestions. Attached are informational lists regarding the suggestions. The first list delineates suggestions for implementation during 2009-10 and 2010-11 fiscal years and the second list delineates suggestions for review and consideration for future fiscal years.

The enclosed rubric was used to determine total points (the higher the number, the more negative impact).

Joyce Lopes thanked both group presidents for the comments tonight, and thanked the committee for working diligently. Joyce reviewed the suggestions to be implemented in:

2009-10

- Categorical flexibility – sweep balances
Cost savings would be \$100,000.00

2010-2011

- Eliminate FY 2010-11 & FY 2011-12 transfer to new school reserves.
- Categorical flexibility – exercise flexibility on-going.
- Reduce substitute pay by not providing the retroactive pay to substitutes when they go over 20 consecutive days and reduce the per day pay.
- No summer school, provide summer school only to credit deficit juniors & seniors and ESY for special Ed.
- Shut down sites during the summer and do team cleaning.
- Eliminate Morrison Landscaping
- Replace Asst. Supt. of Personnel with a Director of Personnel.
- Eliminate stadium lights usage.

Cost savings would be \$1,841,200.00

Joyce reviewed the suggested budget cuts for 2009-10

Paul recommended that the staff continue to work with the city on transportation of inner city students.

Mrs. Stevenson suggested looking at site allocations, and Car allowances.

Mr. Carras thanked the budget committee for their work.

Mr. Carras shared we're one of the few districts that are maintain jobs for employees, putting more people out of work is not good.

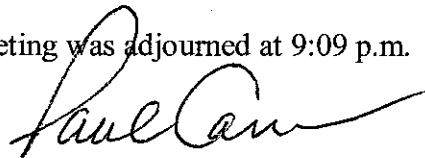

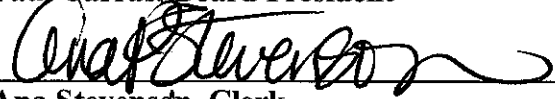

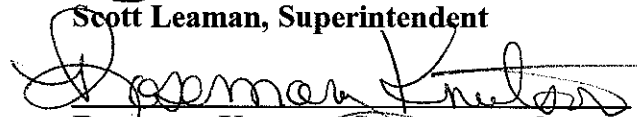
