8.3 Action **ADOPTION OF NEW ACCEPTABLE USING POLICY AR 4040E; BP/AR 4040 REVISIONS – Leaman (10-11 G & O Component I, IV, V)**

- Current Board Policies address the use of technology by district staff through BP 4040 and AR 4040 – Employee Use of Technology. Similar to the recently adopted Student Acceptable Use Policy (Student AUP), the attached AR 4040E Staff Computer, Network, and Internet Safety Acceptable Use Policy (Staff AUP) addresses specific areas of BP/AR 4040, and is intended to be used as an annual, renewable Staff AUP agreement. The proposed BP 4040 and AR 4040 revisions and the new AR 4040E have been reviewed by district administration and reflect changes based on CSBA recommendations and recent updates in technology.

Mary Boyle asked Bob Lyons, Director of Technology to explain the purpose of adopting Exhibit 4040 which is for employee use. The revisions made to BP/AR 4040 were due to modern technology. 


