7. **PUBLIC HEARING**

Education Code 60119 requires that the governing board of a school district hold an annual instructional materials public hearing to determine whether the district has sufficient standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials for students in each of its schools. A ten-day notice of the public hearing is required. Notices of Public Hearing were sent to news media and to our local schools on September 9, 2010.

Mr. Carras opened the public hearing for anyone interested in speaking. There being no questions the public hearing was closed.

8.1 Action **RESOLUTION NO. 10/11.7 RE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS - Boyle** (10-11 G & O Component III, IV, V)

●Education Code 60119 requires that the governing board of a school district hold an annual instructional materials public hearing to determine whether the district has sufficient standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials for students in each of its schools.

Western Placer Unified School District has followed state requirements regarding the adoption of appropriate standards-aligned textbooks for grades K – 12 and provides sufficient textbooks and instructional materials in all core academic areas.

Mary Boyle reported the public hearing is required annually to ensure all students have textbooks. Motion Mrs. Stevenson, seconded by Mrs. Gage, and passed by a 5-0 roll call vote. Roll call vote: Gage, Long, Stevenson, Haley, Carras

8.2 Information **BASIC AID ANALYSIS - Lopes** (10-11 G & O Component III, IV, V)

●Basic Aid status is defined as the point at which the property taxes of a district exceed apportionment. At that point, the district receives its proportional share of property taxes. Western Placer Unified School District has been in a basic aid status for several years. However, the District is also sponsor of Horizon Charter School. Under Education Code 47663 this made the District eligible for supplemental funding of 70 cents on each dollar of basic aid funding transferred to the charter school. While this funding was welcomed, staff thought it prudent to look at all aspects of basic aid for the District.

Joyce Lopes reviewed a power point presentation on Basic Aid. The Board of Trustees will need to give Joyce Lopes direction on an amount that should be cut. This will need to take place at the second meeting in November. We should be at a balanced budget by December 16<sup>th</sup>. The board engaged in a group discussion on Basic Aid.

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**8.3 Action**      **DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS BUSES - Lopes** (10-11 G & O Component III, IV, V)

•Whereas the Western Placer Unified School District has made strides to modernize its aging bus fleet by purchasing buses with reserve funds and by participating in the Lower-Emissions School Bus Program, the District now has in its inventory, the following buses which are not currently in use.

Joyce Lopes reported on the process that will be used for those that are no longer being used. Our district will use a salvage company to see if the district can get surpluses. The company will come out and take pictures and put them on eBay to sale. Motion by Mr. Haley, seconded by Mr. Long, and passed by a 5-0 vote to approve disposal of the surplus buses.

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
