**3.1 CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL-EXISTING LITIGATION**

WPUSD, as intervener, v. Edge Development; NTD/Stichler; NTD Edge Design Builders; Mountain States Steel, Inc.; and DOES 1-100

The governing board met in closed session to consider settlement and release agreements in the matter of:  
Sacramento County Superior Court Case No. 34-2009-0067354 as previously transferred from Placer County Superior Court Case No. SCV-25083 as previously transferred from Riverside Superior Court Case No. RIC 480114; and The Agreements have been signed by the opposing parties; and

The substance of the Agreements are that the opposing parties will pay the District a settlement amount in return for the District dismissing with prejudice the District's action against the parties (NTD-EDGE, NTD, EDGE and Mountain State Steel) arising out of certain preconstruction development, management services, architectural services, construction and related services. Motion by Mrs. Stevenson, seconded by Mr. Haley, and passed by a 5-0 vote to approve the offer of settlement of pending litigation under the terms and conditions as set forth in the subject Settlement and Release Agreements.

**6. COMMUNICATION FROM THE PUBLIC**

**Jennifer VanSant** spoke as a parent of a First grader, and asked to bring back the grading advance, which exceeds grade level standards. She shared her daughter's reading abilities. Her hope would be the board would consider bringing back the grading, and hold the children to a higher standard, and those who are meeting the state standard allow them to advance to the next level, that would be more rewarding to the students.

**Virginia Cosh** spoke regarding the change in the report cards, and was disappointed of the change. She feels we should challenge our students and raise the bar, she feels they will go for it, if we keep bringing the bar down for them, why would they try harder. Give the kids a challenge, the parents will like it as well.

7.5 Deputy Superintendent of Educational Services – Mary Boyle

- Early Assessment Program – Mary reported the program gives students an early signal of college readiness, EAP helps connect students. Each of the community colleges have placement tests. The components of the EAP Test 11<sup>th</sup> grade English test are CST in English, Supplemental, EAP Essay, Math: CST in math – Algebra II or summative math, Supplemental 15 EAP Questions, LHS offers classes two days a week to help with the test, this program is being offered to bridge the gap for the students to make sure they are college ready.

8.2 Information/  
Discussion SECOND AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH SUNCAL LINCOLN CROSSING LLC REGARDING RESERVATION OF PROBABLE SCHOOL SITE(S) WITHIN THE LINCOLN CROSSING PLAN AREA – Allen (10-11 G & O Component I, IV, V)

• A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was entered into on June 2, 2003 for payment of school fees within CFD #2, and also for reservation of school sites within the Lincoln Crossing Plan Area and provisions on procurement of these sites. On November 17, 2004 an amendment to the original MOU was entered into specifying a timeline for purchase of the reserved sites.

Cathy Allen reported this is an MOU that needs to be addressed, and since measure J did not pass we will need to look at other avenues as to what should be done. Mr. Leaman shared a decision will need to be made, and we feel strongly that the property will be needed. Cathy reported we will

shortly be going into financial hardship. The Board of Trustees requested Cathy negotiate a price and a longer time frame.

**8.3 Information** **BUDGET REDUCTIONS AND ASSUMPTIONS REVIEW – Lopes**

**Discussion/Action** *(10-11 G & O Component I, IV, V)*

•The district is currently deficit spending and faced with budget reductions. The Board of Trustees has given direction to staff to achieve a balanced budget by 2012-13. The budget committee will begin meeting in December, 2010 to identify reduction recommendations for the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees needs to give the budget committee a target amount of reductions for 2011-12, 2012-13, and future years if necessary. In preparation, the Board has reviewed budget assumptions, enrollment data, revenue assumptions and the multi-year projections

Joyce Lopes presented a power point to review budget reductions and assumptions, indicating the district must achieve balance between Reductions and reserves. We would need to identify what cuts to make, and back fill with federal monies.

**Mike Agrippino** commented on the budget situation and reported he really appreciated what he heard tonight, and does not want to see jobs cut and keep programs. He reiterated WPTA is willing to be an active participant in the budget process, and appreciated the opportunity to collaborate. He reported looking over the latest budget scenarios in the packet, but hasn't had a chance to discuss with the membership, but feel the cuts spread over 4 years look very promising. The teachers association believes it has potential for strong teacher support, are appreciated the prudence in measure quality of this approach.

**8.4 Information/** **SCHOOL FUNDRAISER INFORMATION – Leaman** *(10-11 G & O*

**Discussion** *Component I, III, IV, V)*

•Based on a Board request, information concerning school-wide fundraiser was collected from each site. The information was collected on last year's fundraisers to ensure a full year of activities. Please note that these are school-wide fundraisers and there could be additional fundraising activities by a single group or athletic team.

Mr. Leaman brought the information that was requested. Mrs. Stevenson's concern was the sale of magazines and how it was getting promoted. She was very concerned about the assembly for the magazine drive. She felt it was a disruption to the students.

**Virginia Cosh** asked how the information on was fundraisers obtained, she added a couple of more that were not reported.

**8.5 Action** **DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS BUS**

●The district received a request from PCOE to schedule an annual organizational meeting in December for the purpose of selecting board officers. This meeting is in reference to Ed Code 35143 which govern the scheduling of this annual organizational meeting. Annual meeting date must be set and sent to PCOE.

Mr. Leaman reported we have to set a planned meeting for the annual organizational meeting. December 7<sup>th</sup>, Motion by Long, seconded by Mrs. Stevenson, and passed by 5-0 vote schedule an annual organizational meeting.

**8.7 Discussion**     **COMMON CORE STANDARDS AND ASSESSMENTS – Boyle** (10-11 G & O Component I, IV, V)

●Common Core Standards and national assessments are on the horizon. In 2009, the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO) and the National Governors Association Center for Best Practices (NGA Center) committed to developing a set of standards that would help prepare students for success in college and career. In September, 2009, College and Career Readiness standards were released, setting the stage for national Common Core Standards (CCS). A voluntary state-led effort coordinated by the CCSSO and NGA, and including parents, educators, content experts, researchers, national organizations (such as AFT, NEA, NCTM, NCTE, etc.) and community groups from 48 states, 2 territories and the District of Columbia worked together to complete the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) Initiative.

Mary Boyle presented a power point explaining the common core standards and assessments.


**Mrs. Gage** shared it has been an enriching experience and feels extremely fortunate.




